Safety and Security within the School Compound

a. Visitors to Report to Admin Centre

For your child/ward's well-being, safety and security are of utmost importance to us. To ensure that visitors into the school compound are adequately monitored, our school policy requires all visitors to obtain a Security sticker upon entering the school and report directly to the Admin Centre. Visitors are not allowed to go into any classroom on their own. Loitering and photo-taking within the school premises are strictly prohibited. We seek your understanding in helping us to ensure a safe environment for all our staff and students.

b. Speed Limit within School Compound

For parents/legal guardians who drive into the school to drop off their children every morning, please note that the speed limit within the school compound is 15 km/h. Please drive slowly and safely.

Please prepare your child/ward to be ready to alight when approaching the drop-off point on the **left** side of the car. Do not alight to open your vehicle door for your child/ward. Be considerate and patient during













morning peak hour. We would appreciate greatly if parents also avoid long goodbyes to prevent further delays at the drop-off point.

c. NO Right turn from 7.00 am to 7.30 am



A right turn restriction has taken effect since 2 January 2020. With the implementation of this restriction, parents can only exit via a left turn from the HDB access road into Yishun Avenue 11 from 7.00 am to 7.30 am.

The implementation of this right-turn restriction was approved by LTA upon completion of the Traffic Impact Assessment (TIA) exercise. TIA was commissioned by MOE in 2017 and this was conducted to ensure an overall efficient and smooth traffic flow for both the school traffic movement and other public road users within the vicinity of the school site.

Alternative Access to Huamin Primary School For Vehicles during peak hours

During peak hours, parents who are dropping off students in vehicles may consider alternative carparks behind Blk 349 and 351. Please note that you are not allowed to drop off your child in front of the Side Gate as there are students crossing the road from Blk 349. Instead, you should park your car behind Blk 349 and 351 and then walk your child to the Side Gate.

Please do not park your car illegally at the Rasa Rasa@Yishun, an eatery opposite the Main Gate. Some parents were observed to be doing 3- point turn, after dropping their child off to school just as the residents drive into their basement carpark at Blk 348, Adora Green. This creates a safety hazard where the students and parents are crossing and walking towards the Main Gate.

Instilling a Stronger Sense of Responsibility and Ownership - Requests to Pass Items and Messages to Students are Strongly Discouraged

Since 2 January 2019, HMPS has implemented a new practice to instil <u>a stronger sense of responsibility and</u> <u>ownership</u> amongst our students. We strongly discourage all parents/guardians from passing items and nonemergency messages to the students during school operational hours. Students will need to learn to pack and prepare their school bags properly each day and remember to bring their personal items such as water bottles, pencil cases, money, or homework instead of relying on their parents or caregivers to bring them to the school on their behalf whenever they forget to do so. Students should also face the necessary inconvenience of not having these personal items in school on that day and learn from their experience.

The school will also discourage requests to pass non-emergency messages to students as these requests could cause disruption to lessons. We encourage you to communicate such messages to your child/ward before he/she reaches school.















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We sincerely seek all parents' support to work hand-in-hand with us in our endeavor to instill stronger discipline and ownership in our Huaminites. Rest assured that teachers will exercise due patience with all students, especially with our Primary One and Primary Two students, due to their younger age. We seek your understanding that the school security personnel and admin office staff will be instructed to adhere to this school practice.
